

NORTH CAROLINA CODE OFFICIALS QUALIFICATION REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES DRAFT



October 28, 2025 - 1:00 PM

The quarterly meeting of the N.C. Code Officials Qualification Board (“Board”) was held via WebEx at 1:00 PM on October 28, 2025.

ITEM 1 – INTRODUCTIONS, ROLL CALL and CONFLICT OF INTEREST STATEMENT

Chairman Thunberg called for a roll call. Thunberg asked each member of the Board to state whether they had actual or potential conflicts of interest for any items on the agenda.

The State Ethics Commission has cited the potential for a conflict of interest for members of the Board who are serving in the following appointments.

- Code officials because they serve on the Board that certifies them.
- Elected officials because local government entities employ code officials.
- Licensed contractors because their companies regularly work with code officials.
- UNC School of Government, because the school provides educational services for code officials who are subject to the jurisdiction of the Board.

Board members should exercise appropriate caution in the performance of their public duties should issues involving their certifications or that of any of their employees who come before the Board. This would include recusing themselves to the extent that their interests would influence or could reasonably appear to influence their actions.

ITEM 4 – Committee Reports

Executive Policies and Procedures Committee did not meet.

Policies & Procedures Committee did not meet.

Qualifications & Evaluations Committee did not meet.

Education & Research met on 10/1/2025 via WebEx.

Danny Couch reported that the 2024 Standard Courses implementation has been moved to January 1, 2027. Rob Roegner made a motion to approve the 2024 Standard Courses implementation date to January 1, 2027. Second by Couch. The motion was adopted by acclamation. Staff will transition EOC exams & Law & Administration to be given via Questionmark. There were discussions between Kenny Weatherington and Rich Hall about notifying the community colleges about the changes.

Couch reported that the Law & Administration exam go-live date is January 1, 2026. There will be two attempts to pass this exam. The exam will be proctored using the record and review process \$25.00 fee assessed by Questionmark. Roegner made a motion to approve the Law & Administration exam go-live date as January 1, 2026, and the fee is set at \$25.00. Second by Michale Slate. El-Admin asked the board members for discussion on the fee. After much discussion the motion was adopted by acclamation.

Investigation Review Committee (“IRC”) met on September 10th and October 17th, 2025.

The committee reviewed the investigations completed by staff for recommendations to the Board. The committee makes the following recommendations to the Board:

No Bass / Dismiss

Roegner made a motion that cases #683 Williams, #685 Mills, and #691 Micklewright and Ward be dismissed. Second by Couch. The motion was adopted by acclamation.

Basis Cases

Roegner made a motion that cases #624 Russell and #678 Cordell be closed, and Mr. Russell has surrendered his certificates. Mr. Cordell has retired, and his certificates have not been

renewed. Mr. Cordell's file be flagged. Second by Kenny Weatherington. The motion was adopted by acclamation.

Other matters for the Board

Forsyth County Fire self-reported an incident of an inspector inspecting without certification. The inspector is now properly certified, and the Committee is satisfied with the actions taken by the jurisdiction and recommend no further action be taken on the matter. Sam Whittington reported that NO vote was necessary.

Permanent rulemaking update - Heuser

- 10/30/2025 – RRC review temporary amendments

Nick Sorensen and Joseph Starling will attend the Rules Review Commission meeting.

- 11/16/2025 –Public comment period ends

The finale adoption can be made at a Special Meeting of the Board or the January 27, 2026, Regular Meeting. Heuser stated that there was no action needed at this time.

Questionmark

- Exam price reconsideration – Heuser/Sorensen

Michael Slate made a motion to set the exam price at \$135.00 per exam to Questionmark. Second by Roegner. The motion was adopted by acclamation. Weatherington asked that these minutes reflect that this motion will reverse the motion that was voted on to set the exam fee at \$100.00. This motion was voted on at the Special Meeting held on September 30, 2025.

Weatherington made a motion to set the exam price at \$100.00. The price would be paid by the examinee. The payment processor maximum fee is \$6.50 (maximum 6.5%). Questionmark's fee is \$60.00, the remainder remitted would go to the board (currently, IRF): \$33.50. The motion was second by Fleming El-Amin. No one opposed the motion. The motion was adopted by acclamation.

- Transition Plan

Kathy Vincent reported on the implementation (COQB) 2026 Trade Exams through

Questionmark. The PSI Contract will expire on 6/30/2026. Vincent stated that you must have completed both exam attempts by 6/30/2026. Communication with the community colleges will go out 2/2/2026. Dual Action will take place on 1/5/2026, applicants can take their exams either with QM or PSI. This will end on 4/30/2026. The only option applicants will have with Questionmark starting on 5/1/2026.

COQB Transition to Questionmark will roll-out Building and Fire 1/5/2026. Electrical, Mechanical and Plumbing will roll out 1/12/2026. Residential Change Out exams will roll out on 1/26/2026. Roegner made a motion to approve the Questionmark Implementation dates or as soon thereafter as possible. Second by Slate. The motion was adopted by acclamation.

ITEM 6 – NEW BUSINESS

- 11 NCAC 08.0602 Nature of Probationary Certificate

Roegner made a motion to delete 11 NCAC 08.0602(a)(4). Second by Slate. The motion was adopted by acclamation. Roegner amended his motion to direct Heuser to delete 11 NCAC 08.0602(a)(4) as an emergency rule change with the Rules Review Committee. Arguing that it is a hazard to the residents of North Carolina. Second by Slate. The motion was adopted by acclamation.

ITEM 8 -- COMMITTEE CHAIR NOMINATION


