There are hundreds of North Carolina counties and cities that employ code enforcement officials certified by the Board. <u>Residential Changeout</u> <u>Inspectors</u> perform field inspections of appliance "like kind" replacements and determine compliance with mechanical, plumbing and electrical code requirements. Some jurisdictions employ inspectors on a part-time or probationary basis.

To access the course create a username and password online through the <u>Create a New CEO</u>" page unless you are an existing code enforcement official and already have an account (i.e. pre-qualified, probationary or standard certificate in any trade).

Follow these steps:

- 1. Using your credentials, log into the <u>NCCOQB online portal</u>
- 2. Click on the Supplemental tab.
- 3. Scroll down to Trade: Residential Changeout
- 4. Click on Enroll COD 3102 1 Residential Changeout Inspector
- 5. Scroll to the top of the page and Click on <u>Go to Course</u>
- 6. Click on the COD 3102 Residential Changeout ..." learning block to begin the course.
