North Carolina Emergency Training Center Expands Training Opportunities

The North Carolina Emergency Training Center (NC ETC) continues to grow as a premier destination for specialized fire and rescue training. With new facilities, cutting-edge technology, and a strong commitment to firefighter safety, the NC ETC is preparing responders from across the state—and the nation—for the toughest challenges.

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony – October 14: Join us for a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on Tuesday, October 14, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. The event will feature both water and Aircraft Rescue Firefighting (ARFF) demonstrations, showcasing the unique training capabilities now available at the center.

Aircraft Rescue Firefighting (ARFF) Training Prop: The NC ETC is now home to a state-of-the-art, full-scale 737/C130 aircraft prop, paired with a 3,500-gallon Hydrocarbon Burn Pit. This one-of-a-kind training environment allows both civilian and military firefighters to prepare for real-world airfield emergencies.

The NC ETC has already delivered more than 60 FAA-139 ARFF training classes, with hundreds of firefighters completing their annual FAA-required training. In addition, the center, in collaboration with NC State University, offers quarterly courses on the use of environmentally safe PFAS-free F3 Firefighting Foam. The next class is scheduled for September 29 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Swift Water Training Village

Another highlight of the NC ETC is the Swift Water Training Village, featuring a one-of-a-kind channel where boats can operate in moving water conditions unlike anywhere else in the nation. Training opportunities include:

- Swift water rescue operations
- Boat handling in swift currents
- Water survival and swim training
- Helicopter-based water rescue scenarios

The Water Training Village, with its five-million-gallon moving water system, is now operational. Crews are currently fine-tuning water flow and operations, with training opportunities opening in the coming weeks.

Phase II Underway: Construction is underway on Phase II of the NC ETC expansion, which will add:

- 116 dorm rooms to house students on-site
- · Cafeteria, classrooms, and office space to support training delivery
- · Warehouse facilities and a Burn Village for advanced, realistic training scenarios
- Additional areas designed to promote interaction, collaboration, and networking among responders

Ratings & Inspections Update

The Ratings/Inspections Division has completed an update to the NC Administrative Rules governing fire departments. This process included a thorough vetting period with input from 53 fire chiefs across North Carolina, as well as representatives from the three regional associations, the NC Association of Fire Chiefs, and the NC State Firefighters Association. OSFM Attorney Kyle Heuser has submitted the updated rules to the NC Office of Administrative Hearings for review and approval. A tentative approval date is expected in the first quarter of 2026.
