#### Nomination Form

Safe Kids North Carolina (SKNC) will recognize **one outstanding individual** at the Safe Kids Conference whose injury prevention efforts have made a **demonstrable impact** on child safety within their community. This award honors an individual whose work goes beyond routine responsibilities and results in meaningful, measurable, or observable improvements in injury prevention outcomes.

Any injury prevention professional may self-nominate or nominate a colleague. Nominees **do not need to be formally affiliated with a Safe Kids Coalition**, but must be actively engaged in injury prevention efforts that support the Safe Kids mission and values.

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#### Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the Safe Kids North Carolina Impact Award (Individual), the nominee must:

- Be an **active participant in injury prevention efforts** through a Safe Kids Coalition or partner organization
- **Not** be a current member of the Safe Kids North Carolina Conference Committee
- Demonstrate work that is clearly guided by the Safe Kids core values of:
  - **Leadership**
  - **Service**
  - **Professionalism**
  - **Inclusivity**

Please provide clear, specific, and well-organized responses. Concrete examples are strongly encouraged. The Awards Committee will rely solely on the information provided when evaluating nominations.

### **1. Impact & Results**
